North Georgia Highroads

The treasure proved fleeting, but northern Georgia continues to reward visitors with its towering waterfalls, secluded gorges, orchards and farms wedged among the mountains, and remote little towns.

Highlights & Facts For The Ideal Experience



Moccasin Creek State Park

Trip Length: Roughly 170 miles, plus side trips

Best Time To Go: Year round. Through the fall this area can become crowded on weekends and winters are sometimes icy.

Must See Nearby Attractions:

1 Amicalola Falls State Park (where a series of cascades tumble a total of 729 ft., off Rte 52 west of Dahlonega)

2 Lake Winfield Scott (a clear lake high in the mountains, Rte. 180 west of Vogel State Park)

Traveler's Notes



Lake Winfield Scott in fall.

+ Brilliant orange and red fall color along Highway 180. It should go without saying that many of the routes through the Chattahoochee and Oconee National Forests reveal the scenic beauty of these special lands.

+ Drive along the Ridge and Valley Scenic Byway, which tours the Armuchee Ridges of the Appalachian Mountains. Several major Civil War battles were fought in this area, most of them centered around the railroad, which stretched from Chattanooga, Tennessee to Atlanta, Georgia.

+ The Russell-Brasstown National Scenic Byway has all these features and presents to its travelers the special character and quality of the area through which it passes. While there, you can stop and enjoy the view from Georgia's highest point, Brasstown Bald.

- Toccoa:** Enjoy the outdoors at Toccoa or Henderson Falls, Paul Anderson Park, or Traveler's Rest State Historic site.
- Tallulah Gorge State Park:** Immerse yourself in awe-inspiring beauty or daring adventures with a glimpse into the past at Tallulah Gorge State Park, where the Tallulah River flows through rugged terrain to carve a complex 1,000 foot geologic formation and five spectacular waterfalls which provide habitat for many unique species.
- Black Rock Mountain State Park:** Georgia's highest state park encompasses some of the most outstanding scenery in Georgia's Blue Ridge Mountains.
- Moccasin Creek State Park:** Sitting on the shores of lovely Lake Burton, Moccasin Creek prides itself on being "where spring spends the summer."
- Lake Chatuge:** Visitors enjoy leisurely strolls along the dam with its spectacular view of the lake and surrounding mountains. With more than 130 miles of shoreline, the lake has numerous finger-like projections of land forming interesting coves.
- Russell-Brasstown Scenic Byway:** Surrounded by the beauty of the Chattahoochee National Forest, this 40.6-mile national byway winds through the valleys and mountain gaps of the southern Appalachians in Georgia.
- Vogel State Park:** One of Georgia's oldest and most beloved state parks, Vogel is located at the base of Blood Mountain in the Chattahoochee National Forest.
- DeSoto Falls:** Located off Highway 129 just inside the National Forest boundary.
- Dahlonega:** A jewel set in the North Georgia mountains with unmatched arts, shopping, lodging, dining, and outdoor
