

Deschambault-Grondines

- Trip Length:** Roughly 160 miles, plus side trips
- Best Time To Go:** May-October
- What to Watch Out For:** Road signs in Quebec are in French, the province's official language, but color-coded signage and pictograms are used extensively throughout the province to aid non-French speaking folks.
- Must See Nearby Attractions:**
 - 1** Montreal
 - 2** Quebec Wine Country (Eastern Townships)




Champlain, Quebec

- The Portneuf region has its own special charm. It is home to the municipalities of Neuville, Cap-Santé and Deschambault, among others, which are members of the Most Beautiful Villages of Québec association, and the region has an extraordinary architectural heritage that is well worth admiring!
- As you continue along your way down Route 138, you will catch glimpses of the St. Lawrence River and the magnificent Lake Saint-Pierre. Designated as a UNESCO World Biosphere Reserve, the Lake Saint-Pierre archipelago, accessible via Berthierville, is a place all nature enthusiasts should visit and is heaven on earth for anyone who likes paddling.
- Once in Repentigny, you have almost made it the end of your trip down one of Canada's oldest roads. You can continue on in a westerly direction to find yourself at the heart of the metropolis or decide to head north to explore the Country Roadscircuit in the Lanaudière region.

Quebec City

- Repentigny:** An off-island suburb located north of Montreal on the lower end of the L'Assomption River.
- Berthierville:** The rich commercial and industrial past of Berthierville is reflected in the opulent houses along Rue Frontenac and Rue Montcalm.
- Lac Saint-Pierre:** The Lac-Saint-Pierre biosphere reserve is an exceptional place with a wide variety of fish and birds.
- Trois-Rivieres:** On the north shore of the Saint Lawrence River across from the city of Bécancour.
- Cap-de-la-Madeleine:** Discover an oasis of peace, greenery and history along the King's Road by visiting the Sanctuaire Notre-Dame-du-Cap
- Champlain:** Located on the north shore of St. Lawrence River, Champlain is also part of the metropolitan area of Trois-Rivières.
- Sainte-Anne-de-la-Perade:** The centerpiece of the town is the Sainte-Anne-de-la-Péride Church, a Catholic church near the banks of the Sainte-Anne River.
- Deschambault-Grondines:** In 1674, The Grondines windmill was built and is the oldest windmill in Québec.
- Cap-Sante:** Spread over plateaus of different heights along the St. Lawrence River, Cap-Santé is one of the oldest parishes in the RCM of Portneuf.
- Quebec City:** This area is the site of the towering Château Frontenac Hotel and imposing Citadelle of Québec.
